

- Participatory Action Research/Action Research
- Evidence-based, research-informed practice

RESEARCH PROBLEM & PURPOSE

- Defining and articulating the problem that you want to address
- Seeking out existing research (literature review)
- Defining and articulating the purpose of your research
 - How will this research inform practice in your work?

- Methods of data collection and analysis




THE CAREER COUNSELLOR PRACTITIONER GRANT FOR PRACTICE BASED RESEARCH

OUR GRANT: THE APPLICATION

Applicant Information Sheet:

- Your contact information
- Project commencement and project completion dates (M/YR)
- Site for the project

- One page research proposal:
 - Title of the project
 - Clear statement of the objectives for the grant
 - Brief description of project (background literature, methodology and the research significance)

OUR GRANT: THE APPLICATION

- One page budget:
 - Indicate how grant funds will be used and the dates they are required
 - Include any other sources of funding to support the project
- PDF copy of certificate indicating completion of Tri-Council's course on research ethics
 - https://tcps2core.ca/welcome
- One letter of support from someone familiar with the project or the applicant's research abilities

- Applications deadline is December 15th
- Notification of decisions are made by email in mid-February
