Part I: Immigration in Canada

Immigration in Canada by the Numbers

1 in 5

Canadians is born outside of Canada (21.9%)



- In 2019, Canada will welcome 330,000 new permanent residents
- Over the next three years, we will welcome 980,000 new permanent residents to the country as targets rise annually.
- By 2036, the proportion of the population born outside of Canada could reach 30%.





But...


- We are not helping people integrate effectively

What is Credential Evaluation?



- Compares academic accomplishments to standards in Canada
- Provides a Canadian academic equivalency
- Helps institutions better understand internationally educated professionals' educational background

Value of Credential Evaluation

- Credential evaluation gives internationally educated professionals proof in-hand of their qualifications in familiar terms
- Recognition of academic credentials is the springboard for pursuing suitable employment, further education, and licensing
- Recognition critical for integration

Credential Evaluation Agencies













Who May Need a Credential Evaluation?

Individuals with international education considering:

- Re-licensing in their profession
- Attending a post-secondary institution
- Employment opportunities
- Immigrating to Canada

Normative Credential Evaluation Process



STEP 1

Applicant creates account and receives a WES reference number.



STEP 2

Applicant refers to required documents resources; requests awarding institution to send documents directly to WES (in sealed envelope).



STEP 3

We verify the credentials, create a report, and deliver it to identified recipients.

Educational Credential Assessment (ECA) for Immigration

WES Gateway Program



Challenge:

How can displaced individuals who only have partial or non-verifiable academic documents prove their qualifications?

Solution:

Validate and assess education of individuals displaced by political unrest, conflict, and natural disasters—even when verifiable documents are not available

WES Gateway Program: Eligibility

Currently available to individuals who:

- Cannot obtain official documentation because of political unrest, conflict, or natural disasters
- Are referred to WES by a designated Canadian partner organization
- Were educated in one of the following countries
 - Afghanistan
 - Eritrea
 - Iraq
 - Syria

- Turkey
- Ukraine
- Venezuela

What Does an Evaluation Look Like?



A document-by-document report is typically required for freshman admission to universities and employment.

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Part III: Credential Recognition

Credential Recognition

- Acceptance of international academic credentials or credential evaluation by employers, regulatory bodies, academic institutions, and immigration authorities
- No universally accepted service
- May require more than one credential evaluation service
- Dependent on end-user recognition



Credential Recognition

- Requires research before taking action!
- Always check first with each university, employer, and/or licensing board for specific instructions



What You Can Do:

Advocating for the Recognition of Credentials

Employment: Help clients market their education and help employers understand and recognize international education

Licensure: Research licensing requirements and explore alternative careers

Education: Navigate educational pathways including assessments and transfer credits

Employment

For clients, include an equivalency statement on résumé under the Education section:

"Evaluated by World Education Services (WES), as equivalent to a four-year Canadian bachelor's degree."

Licensing Bodies

- Regulations differ by province/territory
- Research requirements:
 - Time
 - Costs
 - Alternative career options

Education

- Conduct an environmental scan on institutions with the program of interest
- Connect with registrars determine requirements for:
 - Credential assessment process
 - Transfer credits
 - PLARs

Steps to Integrate Internationally Educated Professionals

- 1. Identify the client's goals
- 2. Understand the purpose for the assessment
- 3. Determine if a credential evaluation is required
- 4. Advise the client to contact end user
- **5. Assist** the client with next steps


